

1	<p><i>R1, R2, 2 Out.</i> The batter gets a base hit to centre and the centerfielder throws the ball home in an attempt to get R2 out. The catcher missed tagging the runner as R2 steps on the catcher's foot instead of the plate. R2 continues to the dugout without touching the plate. The runners continue to advance and R1 ends up on 3rd and the BR on 2nd. The pitcher takes the ball from the catcher and runs in to the dugout to tag R2 on an appeal for the 3rd out. The umpire calls R2 out for the 3rd out of the inning.</p>	<p>FALSE 7.08k, 7.10d, 7.04c</p>
2	<p><i>Count 3-2.</i> During the Peewee Championships, the pitcher on the mound is at 21 pitches, which is close to the 25 pitch count limit that would allow him to pitch again the next day. The manager tries to go out to the mound to take his pitcher out so he can pitch him again the next day. The umpire stops the manager from visiting the mound a second time during the same batter. The manager stands in front of his dugout and takes the pitcher out of the game from there and puts in a new pitcher without visiting the mound. 3	<p><i>2 Out. Bases loaded. Tie game. Bottom of the 9th.</i> The batter is hit by a pitch. He is awarded and advances to 1st base as R3 scores. R1 believes the game is over, and runs across the field to join the celebration. The defense appeals that R1 didn't touch 2nd. The umpire denies the appeal and the game is over.</p>	<p>TRUE 4.09(b)</p>
4	<p><i>R2, R3. 1 Out.</i> The batter hits a comebacker to the mound. R3 starts to advance and gets caught in a rundown between home and 3rd. During the rundown, R3 interfered with the 3rd baseman trying to field the throw. R2 had advanced during the rundown and was standing on 3rd when the interference occurred. The umpire declares R3 out for interference and R2 remains at 3rd.</p>	<p>FALSE 2.00 - Interference (a)</p>
5	<p><i>Batting Order: Able, Baker, Charles, Daniel, Edward, Frank.</i> Daniel bats in the place of Charles. Baker, while on 1st steals 2nd. On the next pitch, Daniel singles and Baker scores. Before the next pitch or play, the defence appeals that the improper batter hit. The umpire should call batter Charles out, return Baker to 2nd and have Daniel bat again.</p>	<p>TRUE 6.07 (b) (1)</p>
6	<p>After the 5th inning an unannounced substitution (Fernandez) enters the game to play 3rd base. Before play starts, the manager realizes that the wrong player has entered the game. The manager advises the umpire that Santos should be the new 3rd baseman. The umpire allows Santos to go to third and Fernandez is still eligible to enter the game.</p>	<p>TRUE 3.08 (a) 3</p>
7	<p><i>R1, 0 out.</i> The defensive manager changes pitchers and puts in Gilbert. Before throwing a pitch, Gilbert picks off R1 for the first out of the inning. The manager now wishes to bring in a different pitcher. The umpire allows the pitching substitution.</p>	<p>FALSE 3.05b</p>

8	While running from 2nd base to home, R2 trips and falls over 3rd base. The third base coach helps R2 to his feet and R2 continues home. The umpire should return R2 to third base.	FALSE 7.09i Penalty
9	During the Junior Nationals, the pitcher for the home team is wearing a turban (religious headgear). The visiting team complains that the pitcher must wear a matching baseball cap the same as his teammates. 12	There is a long fair fly ball over fair territory down the RF line, in the umpire's judgment, that clearly appears to be a home run. 16	<i>R2, 2 out.</i> In the top of the ninth inning with the visiting team trailing 5 - 4, the catcher interferes with the batter who singles to centre field. The center fielder throws out the runner attempting to score from 2nd, which appears to end the game. The visiting team manager informs the umpire that he wishes to accept the interference penalty, putting the runner back on 2nd base and the BR at 1st. 18	<p><i>R1, R2. 0 out.</i></p> <p>The batter hits a high fly ball which the umpire rules could be easily caught toward the shortstop. The shortstop allows the ball to land in front of him and catches the ball on one bounce. Seeing the ball uncaught, R2 breaks for 3rd base and is tagged out by the shortstop. The shortstop then throws the ball to 2nd base in an attempt to force out R1 who is still standing on 1st base. This should be ruled an infield fly and R1 and R2 should be called safe.</p>	<p>FALSE 2.00 Infield Fly</p>
19	<p>A 3rd baseman entering the game as an injury replacement is allowed 8 warm up throws.</p>	<p>FALSE 3.03</p>
20	<p><i>R2, R3. 1 out. 1-1 count.</i></p> <p>R3 attempts to steal home, R2 remains at 2nd. The catcher interferes with the batter and the pitch is fouled off. 21	<p>During the third inning of the Bantam Canadian Championships, the home team manager takes out his starting shortstop – Sylvester and puts in Pong. In the fifth inning, he takes out Pong and puts in Sanchez. The game becomes close in the last inning and the manager comes out and tells the umpire that he is putting Sylvester back in at shortstop. 22	<p><i>R1, R2.</i></p> <p>The batter hits a sinking fly ball to shallow center, for which the center fielder dives. 25	<p><i>R1, R2, R3. 1 out. Tie game. Bottom of the 9th.</i></p> <p>All of the runners are advancing on the pitch while the batter squares and bunts a pop-up between the pitcher and the 1st baseman. The pitcher catches the pop-up, jogs over and steps on 1st base to retire R1, who had left early. This makes the third out. All runners had advanced to the next base before the pitcher touched 1st base. The run doesn't count because the third out was a force out. 26	<p><i>Count: 2-0.</i></p> <p>A manager visits his pitcher. Several pitches later, with the count 3-2, the manager requests time and heads for the mound again. After being warned by the umpire that he can't make this trip, the manager returns to the dugout without having reached the mound. The pitcher must be removed from the pitching position at the completion of the at-bat.</p>	<p>FALSE 8.06 (c)</p>
27	<p>On a bunt up the first base line, the ball passes the pitcher. Then the batter and the pitcher collide and obstruction is signaled. The 1st baseman plays the ball and throws wildly to 1st base. 28	<p><i>2 out. Count 3-2.</i></p> <p>The batter takes a pitch right down the middle of the plate; the plate umpire calls it strike three. 29	<p><i>R1. Count: 3-1.</i></p> <p>The pitcher does not stop in his delivery to the plate. The plate umpire calls a balk, but the pitcher delivers the pitch for a called ball. R1 is awarded 2nd and the batter remains at bat with the count 3-1.</p>	<p>FALSE 8.05 Approved Ruling</p>
30	<p><i>R1, R2, R3. 2 outs.</i></p> <p>The batter grounds to the 3rd baseman, who throws home for an attempted force out. R3 beats the throw home and is called safe. The catcher immediately throws to 1st in an attempt to force out the BR. The catcher's throw hits the BR in the back who is 8 feet from 1st when he gets hit. The BR was running with only one foot in the running lane. The inning ends with the umpire calling the BR out for interference and scoring the run.</p>	<p>FALSE 2.00 Interference 6.05k 4.09</p>
31	<p><i>R1, R2, R3. 0 out.</i></p> <p>The batter doubles and both R3 and R2 score. R1 is obstructed while rounding 3rd base. He continues home and is called safe at a play at the plate. On the throw home, the BR attempts to go to 3rd base. The catcher now throws to 3rd and the BR is declared out. The umpire allows the play to stand.</p>	<p>FALSE Baseball Canada Interpretation</p>
32	<p><i>Score: 7-2 for the home team after 6 innings.</i></p> <p>In the top of the 7th, the visitors score 4 runs while playing in a light rain. The bases are loaded with 1 out. The lights fail.
